Benefits of online care for your employees

A 2022 survey conducted by Environics Research, on behalf of Dialogue Health Technologies¹, found that 82% of working Canadians believe employers should provide virtual care services for their employees.

Convenient appointments

Telemedicine is useful for chronic conditions that require frequent check-ins with medical professionals such as heart conditions or asthma. In many instances, employees must take time off work to attend a medical appointment. If being absent from work means the employee has the time deducted from their pay, they might ignore a medical problem, which could lead to more serious complications later. Telemedicine can provide a convenient way for an employee to see a doctor and get the direction of a medical professional to stay on track with managing the employee's health without falling behind on the job.

Mental health care

Mental health care is also available as an online support. For example, Chambers Plan Health options include Teladoc with its whole-health approach. For more serious issues, Plan members can get help with finding a mental health care provider with Teladoc Mental Health Navigator. Teladoc's continuum of care also encompasses Teladoc myStrength, which is a digital mental health program that provides stepby-step guidance for users who want help with minor mental health issues such as workplace stress, insomnia, and some forms of anxiety and depression, and is available with all benefit packages from Chambers Plan. Prescriptions and travel

In a telemedicine visit, an often-overlooked service is that doctors are able (when appropriate) to prescribe medications and send that prescription to the patient's pharmacy. This can be a time-saver for an employee or their family members with common prescriptions that need to be renewed, such as antibiotics, birth control, antidepressants or hypertension medication.

As well, some telemedicine providers such as Teladoc Health (which is available with all Chambers Plan Health options) provide service in both Canada and the U.S., so even if an employee gets sick while travelling, they can talk to a doctor.

The convenience of telemedicine and keeping medical appointments available to employees with time-crunched lives reduces absenteeism and can improve their health and productivity, which is why it's a valuable addition to employee benefits packages.
